The Sociolinguistics Symposium 19 will take place in the Henry Ford Building of Freie Universität Berlin. It is located at the junction of Garystraße and Boltzmannstraße, near the subway stop Oskar-Helene-Heim (line U3) in the southwestern part of Berlin.


The Henry Ford Building was built between 1952 and 1954 according to the plans of the Berlin architects, Franz Heinrich Sobotka and Gustav Müller. It was named after Henry Ford II, who arranged the donation of 8.1 million Deutschmarks by the U.S.-American Ford Foundation for the construction of this building complex.

- Cross street and turn to 'Garystraße'
- Go to 'Garystraße 35' and find yourself in front of the Henry Ford Building

ACCESS TO VENUE BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT

From railway station 'Potsdamer Platz' (Length of journey: 0:50 h)

- Take U-Bahn (underground) U2 (direction 'U Theodor-Heuss-Platz')
- Change trains at 'U Wittenbergplatz'
- Take U3 (direction 'U Krumme Lanke')
- Get off at station 'U Oskar-Helene-Heim'

From railway station 'Lichterfelde West' (Length of journey: 0:20 h)

- It is a walk of about 15 minutes.
- Exit on the left and leave station at the right exit.
- Follow 'Hans-Sachs-Straße' and turn left on 'Drakestraße'.
- Cross 'Unter-den-Eichen' and follow 'Habelschwerdter Allee'.
- Turn left on Ladenbergstraße until you reach 'Corrensplatz'.
- Follow 'Corrensplatz' and turn right on 'Garystraße'.

If you prefer to take a bus:


- Take M 11 (direction 'U Oskar-Helene-Heim')
- Get off at station 'U Oskar-Helene-Heim'
- Take X 11 (direction 'U Dahlem Dorf')
- Get off at station 'Hittorfstraße'
- Cross the street
- Follow 'Hittorfstraße' until you reach Van't-Hoff-Straße and turn right on 'Van't-Hoff-Straße'
- Turn left on 'Boltzmannstraße', now you turn right again on 'Garystraße' and find yourself in front of the Henry Ford Building

From railway station 'Rathaus Steglitz' (Length of journey: 0:30 h)

- Take bus X83 (direction 'U Dahlem Dorf') and get off at station 'U Dahlem Dorf'
- Take U3 (direction 'U Krumme Lanke')
- Get off at station 'U Oskar-Helene-Heim'

ACCESS TO VENUE BY CAR

- Take motorway A115 and take exit 4 'Zehlendorf'
- Follow the road 1 to 'Berlin Zentrum'
- After about 7 kilometers, turn left onto 'Thielallee' about 300m and turn left on 'Garystraße'



BY PLANE

From Tegel Airport (Length of journey: 1 h)

- Take Bus X9 or bus 109 (direction 'S+U Zoologischer Garten')
- Change trains at 'U Jakob-Kaiser-Platz'
- Get on the underground line U7 (direction 'U Rudow')
- Change trains at 'Fehrbelliner Platz' to line U3 (direction 'Krumme Lanke')
- Get off at station 'U Oskar-Helene-Heim'

From Schönefeld Airport (Length of journey: 1:30 h)

- Take the S-Bahn line S45 (direction 'S+U Bundesplatz') to 'Südkreuz'
- Get off at Südkreuz and change trains to S41 (direction circle line 41) to 'Heidelberger Platz'
- Change trains at 'Heidelberger Platz' to line U3 (direction 'Krumme Lanke')
- Get off at 'U Oskar-Helene-Heim'
- Take Bus 171 (direction 'Hermannplatz') to 'U Rudow'
- Get off and take U7 (direction 'S+U Rathaus Spandau')
- Change trains at 'U Fehrbelliner Platz' and take U3 (direction 'Krumme Lanke')
- Get off at 'U Oskar-Helene-Heim'

Internet

At the conference venue, you will get free internet access through WiFi. The easiest way to connect your computer or smartphone to the internet is by using the eduroam infrastructure. If your home university is part of the eduroam initiative (www.eduroam.org) and you are connecting to the internet via eduroam at your home university, things may work out of the box at the campus of Freie Universität. Just try to connect to the wireless network with the SSID '**eduroam**'. Please note that you can only connect one device to the eduroam network at a time (i.e. connecting laptop and smartphone simultaneously will not work).

If eduroam does not work for you, you should connect to the wireless network with the SSID '**conference**' and open an arbitrary web page. Instead of the web page called, a form will appear, in which the user can enter the conference key '**r7znyt2y**'. Access to the wireless network will then be granted, and the user will be automatically forwarded to the web page that was originally called.

Attention: Connections to the wireless network 'conference' are not encrypted and can be eavesdropped. To ensure confidentiality and encryption, please use appropriate protocols (https, ssh, VPN).


